The Conservancy's Mission Statement The Chestnut Ridge Conservancy was formed in 2010 to support the restoration and preservation of the rich natural, recreational, and historic resources that comprise Chestnut Ridge Park.





The Conservancy's Association with Erie County & Erie County Park's Department

- In a collaborative relationship through a "memo of understanding" with Erie County, originally signed in 2011 and renewed for another five year period in 2016, the County and the Chestnut Ridge Conservancy have agreed the Conservancy shall assist the County with the preservation, restoration, rehabilitation and enhancement of Chestnut Ridge Park.
- A short summary of the Memo of Understanding states: "The CRC shall present to the Commissioner of Parks, Recreation and forestry such projects it envisions will preserve, restore, rehabilitate, or enhance the Park and its use by County Residents. The Commissioner shall make the determination on a project-by-project basis as to whether the CRC takes a lead role or is a contributor to a County-led project. These projects shall be consistent with the vision of the County and the CRC. The GRC may build volunteer relationships to assist the County Parks Department with various projects through out the park."
- To this end, the Chestnut Ridge Conservancy expresses it's sincere thankfulness to Erie County to be allowed the opportunity to be apart of and support the well being of Chestnut Ridge Park. We would also like to give special thanks to Commissioner Dan Rizzo, Superintendent JJ Thomas and his park staff for their support and the good working relationship we have achieved these past years.

CRC Capital Projects Accomplishments Pre-2018

Since it's incorporation in 2010 the CRC has invested over \$150,000 and thousands of volunteer hours in Chestnut Ridge Park

- New main entrance signs & eternal flame trail sign: \$29,000
- Hamilton Ward Memorial Plaque: \$1,200
- Binocular viewer at the casino: \$1,200
- Casino murals restoration: \$40,000
- Wildflower gardens: \$10,000
- Park benches & swings: \$5,000
- Portable bicycle / sled racks: \$3,000
- Tennis court wind screens: \$2,500
- Dog waste collection stations: \$1,000
- Blue Star Memorial Garden: \$1,000
- Planting of 10 oak trees at Eternal Flame parking
 - area \$3,000 donation.





CRC Capital Project Accomplishment 2018

In 2018 the CRC employed DMR Masonry to conduct stonework restoration on four needed areas. The sites were suggested to the CRC by the Parks Department. The restoration cost \$15,000. The results were a dramatic improvement.

- Decorative wall stonework repair near the casino parking lot
- Tennis courts water fountain stonework pad and seat
- Main entrance bathroom shelter stonework.
- Two Beehive monuments at the entrance to the park.



CRC Capital Project Accomplishments 2018

Also in 2018, with another donation of five oak trees from Schichtels Nursery, the CRC, Schichtels and Parks Staff planted the five oak trees at the Eternal Flame trail head Parking Lot area making a full compliment of fifteen oak trees along the front side of the parking lot significantly improving the barren look of the trail head parking area.

Community Outreach Events

- The Chestnut Ridge Conservancy also plays a role in bringing people to the park for various events and recreational happenings.

 - Annual Summer Tennis Tournament Highly competitive WNY tournament bringing over 180 tennis players together in a 4 day event.

 - Outdoor movies on the hill big screen movies located on the hill facing down from the casino brings hundreds of kids and family members to the park.
 - United Way day of caring bringing together volunteers from all around to do various spring cleanup and maintenance projects within the park.
 - Santa Land & Winterfest Winter events for kids held around the casino.
 - Working with local boy scout troops on Park projects, Legacy 11 fishing peer, Eternal Flame Trail Rest Area
 - Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra Concerts Our 2016 concert brought over 10,000 people to the park for the event.

2019 Capital Projects Overview

- In 2019 the CRC is engaging in four capital project initiatives for the Park
 - Establishing Eternal Flame Trail Head Rest Area (Nearly completed)
 - Estimated project cost \$10,000
 - CRC commitment to project \$5,000 (County Parks provided \$5,000 of crushed stone)
 - Collaborative project with Erie County Parks & Boy Scout Troup 285 of Orchard Park
 - Casino Floor Refinishing Project
 - Estimated project cost \$18,000
 - CRC commitment \$19,000
 - Tennis Court relighting project
 - Estimated project cost \$30,000 \$40,000 (Replacing all fixtures)
 - Estimated project cost \$15,000-\$20,000 (Replacing fixtures on upper four courts only)
 - "All Inclusive Playground" project
 - **Estimated project cost \$360,000 \$450,000**
 - **○** CRC commitment \$25,000

Casino floor refinishing project

- Received \$18,000 quotation for floor refinishing and repair spots.
- CRC financing entire cost of refinishing.
- Park superintendent JJ Thomas coordinating with vendor on timing and oversight of work.
- Anticipated completion by May 31st.





Tennis Court Re-lighting & fixture replacement project

- CRC Budget \$15,000
- Potential project costs with all courts \$30,000-\$40,000
- Potential project cost with just the upper four courts: \$15,000 \$20,000
- Potential additional funding source USTA – Very Competitive \$3,000 perhaps.
- Will seek other funding sources John Mills, County Legislature, other private funding.
- Awaiting more detailed quotes from M & M Electrical, Frye Electrical & Ferguson Electrical.





Playground for all project

- Possible likely cost \$360,000 \$400,000+ range depending on many variables. Eg... community installation which could save \$60,000.
- CRC Commitment \$25,000
- Settled on Parkitects, Inc. Local playground developer. Ben Fraiser, project manager.
 - Parkitects has done "all inclusive "playground builds in Hamburg, Orchard Park and with Masons Mission in Pembroke to name a few.
- Erie County & Erie County Parks has given us their thumbs up on the project.
- The Park's department has also identified a site location and has committed to preparing the site location for installation as well as future maintenance.
- The CRC has employed a grant writer (Mary Simpson) to help seek out foundation funding for the project and build community support and other avenues of funding.
- So far, we've received very positive feedback from initial meetings with Erie County legislature representative John Mills, State Senator, Chris Jacobs and other County Administration officials.




