About the Conservancy, it's beginnings, and its future...

In an effort to assist the County of Erie in preserving and restoring Chestnut Ridge Park in the midst of budget cuts and rising expenses, a dedicated group of concerned citizens came together in 2008 to form the Chestnut Ridge Conservancy.

Officially incorporated in 2010 as a not-for-profit 501(c)(3) organization the Conservancy was established to support the restoration and preservation of the rich natural, recreational and historic resources that comprise Chestnut Ridge Park.

The Conservancy is a all volunteer organization comprised of a non-paid Board of Directors. The members of the Board work in partnership with Erie County Department of Parks, Recreation and Forestry through a legal Memo of Understanding with Erie County. The Conservancy's funding stream is based on memberships, general donations and a once a year Gala fund raiser. Through the past years the Conservancy has accomplished some very notable achievements for Chestnut Ridge Park. See our achievements page.

As is the case with most not-for- profit organizations, funding new initiatives big or small remains a challenge. Today's Park perseveration and restoration projects whether they are big ones or smaller ones, cost a lot of money. Even simple stone work restoration can run into the tens of thousands of dollars.

The Conservancy remains committed to continue as a viably funded organization, to utilize its resources to help with occasional calling from the Erie County Parks Department on various restoration or preservation projects. Community support is essential for the Conservancy to remain as a viable funded organization.

Chestnut Ridge Park

Excerpts from Erie County Park Commission booklet published 1939

"South easterly from Buffalo there is a gradual rise towards the foothills of the Allegheny Mountains in Pennsylvania. The first sharp rise in this direction from the gently sloping basin which surrounds Buffalo at the foot of Lake Erie has an elevation of about 1200 feet. It is about seven miles inland from Lake Erie. One of these ridges swings westerly to merge in the uplands on the eastern side of the Eighteen Mile Creek valley which extends southward. Along the crest of this ridge Erie County pioneers found many enormous chestnut trees and ever since that time, this section, as been known as Chestnut Ridge"

. With an overlooking panoramic vista of Lake Erie, the City of Buffalo, Village of Orchard Park and other towns now sits Chestnut Ridge Park, the crown jewel of Erie County's Park System.

Chestnut Ridge Park consists of 1,213 acres of park land, originally named for the chestnut trees on its hills, it is currently the largest park operated by the Erie County Department of Parks, Recreation and Forestry.

The Park property was acquired by Erie County in 1926, and it was one of the first parks established by the County. The park's facilities and landscapes were improved substantially by the Works Progress Administration throughout the 1930s. The Park lands include some of the most beautiful natural scenery and vistas to be found anywhere in Western New York



Erie County Parks Commission

- Established in 1924 to identify land in Erie County suitable for the establishing and developing a county parks system.
- Was an all-volunteer commission.
- Chestnut Ridge Park originally 320 acres of land was purchased from the Grace, Graves, Zell, and Benning families. \$24,050 total paid for the land (\$75/acre)
- Upon his death, Hamilton Ward (pictured above)bequeathed another several hundred acres of land to Chestnut Ridge Park.

Hamilton Ward, Jr. Monument Re-dedication - Spring 2022 Chestnut Ridge Park


Dedicated to HAMILTON WARD, JR. (1871-1932)

A prominent Buffalonian and an ardent conservationist who was instrumental in the establishment and design of Chestnut Ridge Park in the 1920's.

Hamilton Ward Jr. also founded Allegany State Park, as well as the Erie County Parks Commission, vital in forming the first four county parks: Como Lake, Ellicott Creek, Emery, and Chestnut Ridge.

As a testament to his devotion to Chestnut Ridge Park, upon his death he bequeathed several hundred acres of his property to the county to become part of the park.



Conservancy Milestones New Tennis Court Lighting

With the Conservancy funding the restoration of the tennis court lighting, for the first time in twenty five years, Chestnut Ridge Park's tennis courts have been given some new "start of the art" lighting. This was a three year project in the making requiring the re-running of electrical conduit across the parking lot, retrenching the wiring to the posts, installing electrical control panels and adding eighteen new 500 watt LED fixtures. None of this project was easy to accomplish. The Conservancy is very grateful to Erie County Parks not only for its approval of the restoration project but also for the critical help needed in the conduit re-trenching and main circuit breaker hookups. With Chestnut Ridge Park now hosting several Community tennis tournaments and the USTA Championships as well as other junior programming and extended evening court time for the local tennis playing community, this project has been a very welcome restoration achievement for Chestnut Ridge Park.

After a twenty-five-year shut down, the Chestnut Ridge Tennis courts once again have operational lighting as an added amenity for Summer Tennis Play! The Chestnut Ridge Conservancy together with the Erie County Parks Department secured the funding and resources to re-wire and replace the upper four courts light fixtures with new "state of the art" 500 watt led sports lights illuminating the Ridge Courts like never before. It's amazing to see the courts so well lighted. All for you to enjoy!

















A Playground for All Our 2021 Signature Achievement!

It all began in 2015 with an idea and a discussion about funding the replacement of some of the aging play equipment in Chestnut Ridge Park with new and inclusive play equipment. Fast forward to 2019, Erie County Park's approval of a CRC plan for a significant brand new "all inclusive playground" and the hiring of a playground fund raiser by the name of Mary Simpson, we ultimately became successful in landing some very big funding \$\$ late in 2020 from the Junior League of Buffalo & Mrs. Ruth Shoemaker of Orchard Park. Many others organizations, businesses and individual donators throughout 2020 and 2021 saw the value and worthiness of the project and also gave significant donations getting us to the fully funded level in 2021 to begin the process of ordering the playground equipment and hiring the architectural firm to do the excavation & installation construction planning. 





